Economic Growth on the Rise

In June the NJMC approved a zoning certificate that will allow global dessert company Bindi to move forward with its plans to expand in Kearny. The project is the latest example of how the NJMC's efforts to attract new development, tax rates and job growth to the region are paying off. In May the NJMC approved a zoning certificate for a major warehouse development in Secaucus and welcomed the opening of a new Bob's Discount Furniture Store, also in Secaucus. The Commission in April approved a variance that will help a Brooklyn scaffolding company with its plans to relocate to Carlstadt. The company, Atlantic Hoisting and Scaffolding, says the move could result in up to 200 new local jobs. For more information, click [here](#) and [here](#).



NJMC Completes Flood Management Project in Carlstadt



The Commission completed work in June on two new tide gates in Carlstadt to help better manage flooding in industrial sections of the borough. The NJMC has invested \$10 million in flood plain management over the past seven years. Recent projects include a \$5.5 million initiative – the largest in the Commission's history – to help handle flooding on Route 17 near the Rutherford-East Rutherford border, one of the busiest commercial arteries in the state. 


NJMC Hosts Butterfly Day

On July 25 the Commission and the Bergen County Audubon Society will host a free Butterfly Day at DeKorte Park in Lyndhurst, the home of the NJMC. There will be butterfly walks for the whole family, information on butterfly identification, and tips on how to plant a butterfly garden, plus contests and door prizes. The festival ties in with the NJMC's new free Butterfly Guide to DeKorte Park and also coincides with the 10th anniversary of the Jill Ann Ziemkiewicz Memorial Butterfly Garden, created to honor a Rutherford resident who was the youngest member of the flight crew of the doomed TWA Flight 800. New Summer Observatory Hours

Summer nights are a great time to stargaze at the NJMC's William D. McDowell Observatory. The observatory is open to the public for free, weather permitting, on Monday and Wednesday nights from 9 to 10:30 p.m. in June and July and 8:30 to 10:30 p.m. in August. The observatory features a research-grade telescope with a 20-inch mirror housed under a six meter retractable dome. Saturn, Venus and Mars should be visible in July. Kearny Marsh Cleanup

On June 6 the NJMC co-sponsored a highly successful cleanup of the Kearny Marsh. Some 40 volunteers worked tirelessly for two hours on a hot and humid Sunday morning clearing weeds and litter along the three-quarter mile nature trail that runs along the marsh. Participants filled dozens of garbage bags and took to canoes to gather trash and other debris from the surface of the marsh.
