NJSEA KEEGAN LANDFILL ACCEPTABLE WASTE DEFINITIONS

(revised January 20, 2016)

The following are the permitted NJDEP waste types and definitions for the NJSEA Keegan Landfill. Note that the NJSEA reserves the right to require testing of any and all of the permitted material proposed for disposal at our facilities.

ID 13 - Bulky waste: Large items of waste material such as furniture. Appliances and electronics are designated recyclables and are specifically not accepted at the Keegan Landfill. Note that bulk loads of mattresses are NOT acceptable, and there should be no more than to 3 – 5 mattresses per load. There should also be no more than a 3-5 tires per container/load. Plastic bags and/or cardboard incidental to bulky wastes and which account for less than 5% of the load (by volume) will be accepted. No toys or small appliances will be accepted, as these should be collected with normal household wastes.

Note that no closed containers including compactor boxes are accepted at the Keegan Landfill.

ID 13C - Construction and Demolition waste: Waste building material and rubble resulting from construction, remodeling, repair, and demolition operations on houses, commercial buildings, pavements and other structures. The following materials may be found in waste from construction and demolition projects: treated and un-treated wood scrap (no lumber in excess of 3 feet is permitted); concrete (must be less than 3 foot x 3 foot x 6 inches deep with no rebar), asphalt, bricks, blocks and other masonry; plaster and wallboard; roofing materials; ferrous and non-ferrous metal (no metal greater than 3 feet in length); non-asbestos building insulation; plastic scrap; carpets and padding; glass (window and door); and other miscellaneous materials; but shall not include other solid waste types. Plastic bags and/or cardboard incidental to construction projects and which account for less than 5% of the load (by volume) will be accepted.

Note that any and all asbestos containing materials (whether friable or non-friable), cardboard and creosoted lumber are specifically not permitted waste materials at the Keegan Landfill.

ID 23 - Vegetative waste: Waste materials from farms, plant nurseries and greenhouses that are produced from the raising of plants. This waste includes such crop residues as plant stalks, hulls, leaves and tree wastes processed through a wood chipper. Tree branches, tree trunks are allowed if less than 3 feet long, but should be directed to less expensive alternatives such as compost facilities. Leaves and grass are not permitted to be landfilled.

ID 27 - Dry industrial waste: Waste materials resulting from manufacturing, industrial and research and development processes and operations, and which are not hazardous in accordance with the standards and procedures set forth at N.J.A.C. 7:26G. Also included are non-hazardous oil spill cleanup waste, dry non-hazardous pesticides, dry non-hazardous chemical waste, and residue from the operations of a scrap metal shredding facility. Note that all ID 27 wastes require pre-approval from the NJSEA Solid Waste Division. Contact Chris Dour at 201.460.4678.

No soil of any quantity is permitted in the landfill unless it has received prior approval from our Office as either an ID 27 waste, clean fill, or for soil reuse as landfill cover. No plastic, fiber or steel drums (whole, crushed, etc.) are permitted at any time. If drums are present in the load, the entire load will be rejected.



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Note that no liquids (flammables, paints, etc.), pesticides, any asbestos containing wastes (friable and/or non-friable at any percentage), ID 10 hazardous wastes and/or County designated recyclables or other regulated wastes are acceptable. All loads are subject to inspection by NJSEA and Waste Management personnel. Haulers will be charged a minimum reloading fee of \$400.00 for any waste that has to be reloaded.

Non-Acceptable Wastes

The following wastes will not be accepted at the NJSEA Keegan Landfill facility:

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| ID 10 | Municipal Wastes |
| ID 12 | Dry Sewage Sludge |
| ID 25 | Animal and Food Processing Wastes |
| ID 27A | Asbestos Containing Wastes |
| ID 27I | Ash |
| ID 72 | Bulk Liquid and Semi-Liquids |
| ID 73 | Septic Tank Clean-Out Wastes |
| ID 74 | Liquid Sewage Sludge |

As noted above, the NJSEA will not accept Regulated Medical Wastes, Hazardous Wastes, Designated Recyclables, Electronic Wastes, Appliances, or liquid or ID 10 hazardous wastes (paints, cleaning fluids, pesticides, etc.).
